About Junior Players

Junior Players was founded in 1955, and is the oldest non-profit children's theater organization in Dallas. Over its existence, Junior Players has striven to meet the changing needs of the community. From 1955 to 1989, Junior Players presented traditional children's theater productions performed entirely by children and teenagers. In 1989, the Board of Directors changed the focus of Junior Players activities, deciding that, Junior Players can best serve the youth of Dallas by providing free programming accessible to all the children of North Texas. Junior Players, therefore, exclusively provides free arts education programs in local recreation and cultural centers, low-income housing developments, elementary and middle schools, and through social service agencies serving youth at risk.

The mission of Junior Players is to encourage intellectual growth, mental well being, and the development of life skills in the youth of North Texas through mentoring, creative expression, and participation in dramatic and arts activities.

This mission is accomplished through:

- Narrowing the arts education gap between low-income partner schools/neighborhoods and their nearby higher-income peers by providing 6,000 hours of arts education programming.
 - Teaching youth to resolve conflicts using non-violent communication strategies such as listening skills, identifying feelings and brainstorming non-violent solution options.
 - Allowing students to participate in high quality arts programming, which expand communication skills, increase self-confidence and increase self-esteem

Junior Players Programs

Junior Players Discover Theater Summer Camps and Discover Ourselves After School Workshops focus on children ages 5 to 18 in underserved areas of the community. Junior Players Discover Shakespeare program combines the best of local high-school acting talent with the professional skills of the Shakespeare Dallas staff in a teen production of Shakespeare presented in performances at Samuell-Grand Park Amphitheatre. In collaboration with a variety of organizations, including Letot, Promise House and the Dallas Independent School District, Junior Players teen and Visions of Peace programs work with high-risk teens who are challenged to write about their life experiences, create and perform their own productions and resolve their conflicts through communication in a non-violent manner. Junior Players' Advanced Acting Workshops and PUP Fest and the D-PAC collaboration (Dallas - Playwriting Arts Collective) programs offer professional training in acting and playwriting for area high school students. Junior Players also offers its Fall Dance Production and Winter Musical Production to North Texas teens with the opportunity to perform at the Moody Performance Hall. Junior Players was excited to bring the first ever youth focused Shakespeare in Prison program to Texas in 2023 - making Dallas home to a groundbreaking new program. This partnership between Junior Players and The Henry Wade Juvenile Justice Center where incarcerated youth will work alongside professional Junior Players teaching artists to learn, and eventually perform, excerpts from one of Shakespeare's prolific works, Henry V.

DIRECTOR'S NOTE

When I first approached this production I, like many, thought I knew the meaning of this story. It's a fun musical based on a fan-favorite movie, right? Through deeper exploration, I came to see how surface-level that assessment was. The story of Legally Blonde is about looking beyond appearances to see the true person inside. As the saying goes, "never judge a book by its cover." Every character in this story is challenged to look within themselves, beyond what others may think of them, and see the truth. This realization is different for each character, but the truth changes everyone, including the audience who may have formed negative opinions about someone in their real lives based on appearances. Elle is finally able to see the truth about herself, and in doing so, learns to see others in a new light as well. She learns that there is more to her than she ever realized, and through self-discovery, others are able to see beyond their own facades as well. Sometimes it's difficult to have confidence and to believe in ourselves because of, or maybe despite, what others say or how they perceive us. However, it is only when we do fully look at ourselves that we can find our true potential and break free from limitations.

It can be hard to believe in ourselves when others don't seem to believe in us. But it's important to remember that we are the only ones who can truly know our full potential. If we believe in ourselves, we can achieve anything we set our minds to. More than ever, we must learn to see the beauty and humanity of all people around us. Our world is full of hatred, but we can choose to listen, love, and look deeper into what we do not understand. In doing so, we can find the beauty within ourselves and in others.
