The Junior Players fine arts enrichment footprint is cementing a legacy of vibrant young artists, community leaders, and business creatives by providing a safe space for ALL. When a child walks into our world, they are surrounded by passionate and talented individuals who understand that each child is unique, with differing socio-economic statuses, language barriers, income, school district funding, and more. They also understand that **none** of these factors should dictate the opportunities our youth receive or the dreams they can pursue. This year we explored themes of family dynamics through our productions of *Be More Chill* and *Crowns of Power: Henry IV* and celebrated much success with our pilot program *Shakespeare with Henry*, the first-ever youth focused Shakespeare program in Texas with incarcerated youth in collaboration with The Henry Wade Juvenile Justice Center. These magical opportunities only exist through the help and support of all our community champions, like you. Year after year, I am humbled by every Junior Players' family member as they contribute their time, offer their hope, and advocate for arts education - because they believe, like we do, that every child deserves to have someone fighting for them.

JUNIOR PLAYERS PROGRAMS

EMPOWERING YOUNG VOICES

Junior Players has provided FREE arts education (including visual, performing, media, and dance) programming to the youth of North Texas since 1955. Junior Players continually adapts programming and outreach to meet the needs in our community. Each year, Junior Players serves thousands of kids and teens throughout the North Texas area.

In 2023 alone, Junior Players has provided **4,359 classroom hours** to youth across DFW, hosting programs in **98 unique locations.**

Junior Players programs teach youth to resolve conflicts using non-violent communication strategies such as reflective listening skills, identifying emotions, and pivoting to non-violent solutions. All Junior Players programs are integrated with TEKS (Texas Essential Knowledge and Skills) objectives for grades K-12, including 110) English Language Arts and Reading, 113) Social Studies, 116) Physical Education and 117) Art, Music and Theatre.



Junior Players provided **179 different Discover Arts** classes featuring a range of **17 different art forms**!



In 2023 alone, Junior Players contracted **64 highly** qualified local artists as Teaching Artists.

Junior Players was excited to bring the first ever youth focused Shakespeare in Prison program to Texas in 2023 – making Dallas home to a groundbreaking new program. This program is a partnership between Junior Players and The Henry Wade Juvenile Justice Center where incarcerated youth will work alongside professional Junior Players teaching artists to learn, and eventually perform, excerpts from one of Shakespeare's prolific works, *Henry V*.

Aptly titled Shakespeare with Henry, this program will draw inspiration from the dozens of pilot programs that have taken place all over the world in the last decade and have illustrated the long lasting effects of exposure to Shakespeare in incarcerated youth. These effects include self-efficacy, improved empathy, and a stronger sense of community and participation in Shakespeare in Prison programs has shown reduced recidivism rates, sometimes by more than half.

While programs like this one have proven themselves successful across the world, this is the first program of it's kind to land in Texas and Junior Players is excited to bring Shakespeare with Henry's debut to Dallas.

Throughout this program, Junior Players intends to develop a passion for learning within our participants, especially those who are at high risk of not completing or continuing their education, as well as develop literacy skills (reading, writing, and oral communication), including those participants who are classified as learning disabled and/or developmentally challenged. Junior Players will also support Social Emotional Learning (SEL) and grow transferrable life skills like responsible decision making, social awareness, relationship skills, self-awareness, and self-management.

In order to prepare for this program, Junior Players hired and trained 4 highly-qualified local teaching artists, who went extensive background checks and training protocols. Through these trainings, Junior Players has emphasized the importance of SEL and Equity, Diversity, and Inclusion (EDI) principles. Through this program, Junior Players teaching artists will be able to relate the universal human themes contained in Shakespeare's works to our participants, including their past experiences and choices, their present situation, and their future possibility.


