About Junior Players

Junior Players was founded in 1955, and is the oldest non-profit children's theater organization in Dallas. Over its existence, Junior Players has striven to meet the changing needs of the community. From 1955 to 1989, Junior Players presented traditional children's theater productions performed entirely by children and teenagers. In 1989, the Board of Directors changed the focus of Junior Players activities, deciding that, Junior Players can best serve the youth of Dallas by providing free programming accessible to all the children of North Texas. Junior Players, therefore, exclusively provides free arts education programs in local recreation and cultural centers, low-income housing developments, elementary and middle schools, and through social service agencies serving youth at risk.

The mission of Junior Players is to encourage intellectual growth, mental well being, and the development of life skills in the youth of North Texas through mentoring, creative expression, and participation in dramatic and arts activities.

This mission is accomplished through:

- Narrowing the arts education gap between low-income partner schools/neighborhoods and their nearby higher-income peers by providing 6,000 hours of arts education programming.
 - Teaching youth to resolve conflicts using non-violent communication strategies such as listening skills, identifying feelings and brainstorming non-violent solution options.
 - Allowing students to participate in high quality arts programming, which expand communication skills, increase self-confidence and increase self-esteem

<u>Junior Players Programs</u>

Junior Players Discover Theater Summer Camps and Discover Ourselves After School Workshops focus on children ages 5 to 18 in underserved areas of the community. Junior Players Discover Shakespeare program combines the best of local high-school acting talent with the professional skills of the Shakespeare Dallas staff in a teen production of Shakespeare presented in performances at Samuell-Grand Park Amphitheatre. In collaboration with a variety of organizations, including Letot, Promise House and the Dallas Independent School District, Junior Players teen and Visions of Peace programs work with high-risk teens who are challenged to write about their life experiences, create and perform their own productions and resolve their conflicts through communication in a non-violent manner. Junior Players' Advanced Acting Workshops and PUP Fest and the D-PAC collaboration (Dallas - Playwriting Arts Collective) programs offer professional training in acting and playwriting for area high school students. Junior Players also offers its Fall Dance Production and Winter Musical Production to North Texas teens with the opportunity to perform at the Moody Performance Hall. Junior Players was excited to bring the first ever youth focused Shakespeare in Prison program to Texas in 2023 - making Dallas home to a groundbreaking new program. This program is a partnership between Junior Players and The Henry Wade Juvenile Justice Center where incarcerated youth will work alongside professional Junior Players teaching artists to learn, and eventually perform, excerpts from one of Shakespeare's prolific works, Henry V.

2024 Future Stars Honorary Chair



State Senator Nathan Johnson represents almost a million people in Texas's Senate District 16, a commercially and culturally vibrant district that sprawls throughout Dallas County. He is a leading voice on the electrical grid, healthcare, governmental transparency, and criminal justice.

As a member of the Senate Committee on Business & Commerce, Johnson played a crucial role in the 88th session's legislation to address the sufficiency, sustainability, and resiliency of Texas's power generation and distribution systems. He also serves on the Senate Committees on

Jurisprudence (Vice Chair); Water, Agriculture & Rural Affairs; and Administration.

In the most recent legislative session, Johnson authored over 150 bills, joint-authored or sponsored nearly 100 more, and sent 49 of them to the Governor's desk for signature. Aiming to ensure that Texans never again lose critical services due to power failure, Johnson devised and secured nearly \$2B for the development and deployment of backup power systems for essential community services throughout the state.

Senator Johnson has demonstrated an unwavering support for public education and to ensuring that our schools can meet the changing demands of a changing environment. During the 87th legislative session, he passed a bill to advance social and emotional learning in the classroom. In the 88th (as well as in the current set of special sessions), he filed a set of transformative education bills, aiming to substantially increase the basic allotment (resulting in large teacher pay raises and greater funding for essential programs), to tie the basic allotment to inflation, to provide educators with paid parental leave and free pre-K, and to base funding on enrollment instead of attendance.

Johnson holds degrees in physics from the University of Arizona and a law degree from the University of Texas at Austin. He is a commercial litigator in the Dallas office of *Thompson Coburn* and has composed music for the classical concert stage and musical scores for the hit anime series *Dragon Ball Z*.


